OUR MISSION HISTORY

Over the past 30 years, the membership of First Baptist Church have participated in, and/or supported numerous mission trips. Some mission trips were sponsored by the American Baptist Churches of PA and DE. Others were organized by FBC, and some were individuals who heard the call.

OHIO

Several years ago, twice, heavy rains created great floods for communities in Ohio. A group of members went to the affected communities and worked with other relief agencies to help. On one visit, members were taken to a large warehouse to be confronted by a mountain of clothes which needed to be sorted.

On another trip, the group was assigned to removing furniture and appliances from flooded homes. Some were assigned to mucking out basements.

PHILADELPHIA

Another year, our church learned that a church in Philadelphia had lost its liability insurance due to the very bad condition of the sidewalks which surrounded the church on three sides. One stretch of sidewalk was 12 feet wide.

Led by one member with construction experience, a large group went to the church to remove and replace the old sidewalk. It was a 4th of July and very, very hot and humid. A week later, the church got its liability insurance renewed.

WEST VIRGINIA

Over the years, members of the church went to West Virginia to repair, but mainly replace old shacks in the area of WV called Appalachia. They made a total of six such trips. All expenses were paid by the First Baptist Church through special offerings and personal donations.

One member, a contractor, used his own trucks and heavy equipment while the others brought their own small tools.

The house, seen here, belonged to a man they called, Cat Man, since he possessed many, many cats. In fact, when they went into the house to retrieve his possessions, before they razed it, they found several,



long dead, cats under the furniture.

After surveying the needs and making plans, the group returned to the church where they pre-built many of the components for a new home for Cat Man in the parking lot and driveway of the church. The components were transported back to the new building site for assembly. The group stayed at a local church at night where warm food and showers were available.
